2012 Student-led Public Health Fair

A team of **AASuccess students** coordinated a Public Health Fair with support from the <u>Vietnamese Medical Society of North East</u> <u>America</u> (VMSNA) and the <u>Fairfax County</u> <u>Health Department</u>.

During the event, **free medical assistance** and **health education** were provided to more than **400 Asian American families** in NOVA.

2020 The Period Project: Advocation for Menstrual Poverty

Menstrual poverty is a stigmatized issue in society. In response to this, student Ashley Rodriguez began the Period Project. She was successful in help raising awareness and \$1,300 worth of feminine hygiene products for 12 local women's shelters.



2021 Typhoon Molave Relief Fundraiser

After Typhoon Molave left destruction in Vietnam, student **Colby Pham** took the initiative to partner with the <u>LaSan</u> <u>Vietnam Organization</u> to lead a fundraiser to support the victims' recovery and the rebuilding process.



His effort resulted in a total of **\$2080** raised and **gift packages** sent to **90 Vietnamese students** which included textbooks, supplies, and uniforms.

2022 Roversity Project

Nicole Ortuno started this project to introduce underserved students at the Second Story Homeless Shelter to the world of STEM. She along with Nico Cardenas facilitated bi-weekly robotics introduction lessons.



The program concluded with the **"Roversity Roboball"** event, a World-cup inspired competition where the students **showcase their creations**.

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
