

AASUCCESS - AN OVERVIEW

ASuccess, a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization, seeks to help students enhance their individual approaches to academic work, career development, and other challenges in life. Through our Life Skills Academy, AASuccess empowers students to identify and cultivate skills necessary for professsional development and civic work. With help from our business support community, AASuccess provides students with informative seminars, internship opportunities, and professional coaching and mentoring. We focus on a personal apporach and address a host of issues, including: confidence, self-discipline, stress management, accountability, citizenship, leadership skills, physical and emotional health, and prudent decision-making. Our overall goal at AASuccess is to help students succeed in life.

AASuccess is open to all residents of D.C. Metropolitan area interested in receiving the benefits of or volunteering in the two main programs: the Life Skills Academy and the Arc360 Civic Projects.

Mission

To foster ethical and humanitarian values in our students while empowering them to achieve personal, academic, professional, and civic fulfillment.

Vision

- To develop, educate, and mentor our students through their involvement with community-based programs that foster ethical, intellectual, and social development.
- To create a self-sustaining learning environment between professional mentors, coaches, and students that is based on mutual trust and respect.
- To empower our students to become future leaders, responsible citizens, and agents for positive changes.



Nine years ago, our AASuccess family was young and small with less than ten students and two to three coaches. Nine years later, we have a family of twenty-five active students, six active coaches and skills mentors, twelve seminars a year, a challenging YouthCon Scholarship, and many projects that serve the community and support our students' growth!

FOREWORD FROM THE FOUNDER

For the past 10 years, AASuccess has provided life skills and leadership training for both youngsters and young professionals via our life skills programs. In that time, we have grown in strength, impact and in numbers of successful career professionals and entrepreneurs who have continued our cycle of "Perfecting the Act of Giving Back." Your generous, tax-deductible donations bridge the funding chasm and enrich the experience of every student, every day.

With a little over \$2,000 donation directed to each of our 30 student beneficiaries, the students have worked passionately along with our trained volunteer AASuccess mentors to initiate and completed hundreds of various internships, externships and civic projects in 2016. Our students have worked year-round in live projects such as work-readiness internships, business start-ups and opportunities directed to social responsibility, health fairs, train-the mentor projects, our signature YouthCon scholarship and AASToday Civic projects. And the list goes on!

No matter how big – or small the project, the focus of AASuccess will always be on the individual. For all of the report's statistics highlighting our work, it is always about people. The student growing up in an under-served Asian family whose native language is not English; the young man or woman whose early decisions have not always taken them on a positive life course, and the seemingly cheerful kid, who is often the only linguistic link for his or her parents and grandparents between the country of his birth, and the country of their future. And parents, regardless of what language they speak, are delighted beyond any words to see their children moving beyond college and into careers that enable them to help support both their family and the community that had helped to nurture them into capable, confident and productive citizens.

That is what makes AASuccess' work unique, heartfelt - and effective. In 2014, AASuccess was a recipient for one of the resolutions approved by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Virginia as a key contributor to provide life skills, civic projects and personal leadership activities aimed to strengthen our local community via youth leadership development. AASuccess shall continue its ongoing strategic objective as a STEM-based, career-focused mentoring program for youth with an emphasis on mostly students of Vietnamese descent. However at AASuccess, no student in need is turned away. Nurturing and training each of our students to become a socially responsible manager and/or leader is the goal of the founder and now, his first group of graduates. For the first time in the history of AASuccess, the terms "entrepreneur", "successful start-ups", "leadership", "training for hundreds of students" have made their way into the spoken language of our senior students. So, your donations are critical to ensure that our life skills program and live projects continue to offer exceptional enrichment opportunities that are the hallmark of SUCCESS.

This year, our goal is to raise \$100,000, and we can't do it without your support. Your donations are the reason these programs exist! With your continued support, we can achieve great things for those who need us.

Thank you for your support of discovering and exploring life skills program. With your help, we can enrich the experience of every student and more, every day!



ORGANIZATION STRUCTURE

ASuccess is organized as a hybrid between conventional and funcitonal management structures, designed to encourage transparent communications, as well as idea-sharing and collaborative activities. The Life Skills Academy students, the technical and life skills coaches, and the progressional volunteer work actively across all programs and projects designed to benefit the entire team, as well as AASuccess and our community.



ORGANIZATION STRUCTURE (CONT.)

- **Board of Directors:** Civic-minded business leaders and career professionals, each having the capacity to provide financial support and to make strategic decisions in leading, executing, and advancing the organization's mission.
- **Founder:** Works closely with the Board of Directors and meets during the Board Meeting on a quarterly basis to discuss about upcoming events and to ensure the flow and overall growth of the organization. Founder provides supports and guidance to program directors if needed.
- Executive Assistant, Program Directors, and Data Analytics: work directly with the Founder to facilitate the Life Skills Academy (LSA) during weekly activities and quarterly LSA Assessments. This is to better customize the learning experience based on each student's strengths, weaknesses, and preferences and to observe their progress over the course of 3 months.

Program Directors:

- Work closely with mentors to make sure both students and mentors follow the procedure and process manual by monitoring their attendance, timeliness, and completion of the 3-month plans. Troubleshoot problems if needed.
- Collaborate with other program directors to provide feedback for each student during the LSA Assessment as well as the Program Graduation.
- **Mentors:** College students and young professionals, responsible for taking care of assigned students' weekly activities including Com_Link entry, individual mentorship session, project, and other activities during the core office hours. Mentors also follow up with parents regarding the progress of their students.



Every week, the AASuccess office is filled with more than 25 students and coaches, 20+ one-on-one coaching/mentoring sessions, enlightening seminars, ongoing projects, and more.


A YEAR IN REVIEW

PROJECTS IN 2015-2016

At AASuccess, we enable our student to improve their soft and technical skills by providing them with lifelong leadership development opportunities. Throughout 2015-2016, we have been able to achieve positive changes by encouraging students in participating in various community-based projects, in which they can apply the knowledge and skills that they have learned in our Life Skills Academy program. These projects are great environment where students have the chance to observe, learn, and interact with our various supporters including senior citizens, business owners, working professionals, public officials, nonprofit organizations, and representatives from the education community.



2016 YOUTHCON SCHOLARSHIP

AASuccess organizes the YouthCon Scholarship every year to award scholarship grants to deserving students in the Washington D.C. metropolitan area. After the essay round, semi-finalists have 5 minutes to present about their ideas in front of a panel of judges, all of whom are honored members and representatives from the DC, MD, VA community.

VIETNAM HUMAN RIGHTS DAY

This project focuses on promoting civic education through innovative projects & social media to increase youth involvement, as well as empowering AASuccess students to take the lead in promoting human rights in Vietnam. AASuccess has attracted more potential volunteers/stakeholders every year due to our work in the community.





SUMMER RETREAT AT THE WHITE HOUSE FARM FOUNDATION

Thanks to AASuccess Board member Scott Plein, at least 20 attendees including mentors, students, and volunteers went on a fun and safe 3-day retreat. This was an opportunity for everyone to relax, get to know each other, and learn about the meaningful historical values of the White House Farm.

BUILD A SCHOOL - LEAVE A LEGACY PROGRAM

About 7 students didn't mind the cold winter day to go out on a 5K walk. The mission of this fundraising walk is to raise up to \$20,000 to build schools in rural Vietnam and make a difference in the lives of many unfortunate Vietnamese children.

DELTA SUCCESS PROGRAM

Dedicated mentors spend at least 1 hour per week through virtual English teaching and interactive life-skill training to provide a rich educational program for many youngers in Vietnam who speak some English and are eager to explore, who have a desire to learn and care about life and family. Seven students were recruited from a countryside in Vietnam - Di Linh district in Lam Dong province.

FINANCIAL REPORT

For fiscal year (FY) of 2015-2016, the total income we received is \$64,161 and the total expense is \$60,349. During this fiscal year, due to a one-time addition of one \$10,000 donor, two fundraising events as well as donations for our AASToday community project, we received more donations as compared to FY 2014-2015 donations. As a result, we have a net income of approximately \$3,800.

Our core programs are all self-sustainable with the current sponsors. For example, the AASToday project has raised approximately \$4,000 within the last six months while only \$5,500 needed for its operations.

Therefore, our General Fund were 100% used toward our essential operations, including classrooms, basic IT necessities serving high school students in the central region of Vietnam, wellness activities, lunches for students/volunteers, and IT support for free immigration services.

For FY 2016-2017, we are planning to hold two major funding events to reach out to the community more frequently for additional financial support and opportunity to help cover the expense for our classrooms and IT infrastructure. Our year-round life skills program along with its live projects and internships have enabled student participants to partner with our professional volunteers, and apply their life skills learning such as running the annual YouthCon Scholarship Programs, serving hundreds of low-income Vietnamese families and students in the rural areas of Vietnam, screening underserved families for health issues, and holding public and seminar events directed to public speaking, technology, emotional intelligence, soft skills, and entrepreneurship.

2016-2017 ANNUAL ACTION PLAN

AASuccess will continue to strive to achieve the goals set out in the 2015-2016 strategic plan. Through a variety of actions that support each goal, we will focus on both new and current actions. The next phase of initiatives from year 2016 will continue to be pursued in 2017, building upon the great work accomplished thus far.

GOAL 1 – STUDENT SUCCESS

- Increase measurable results in both academic records (including GPA scores, internship scores) and emotional quotient (including soft skills scores and the overall life skills scores) of all green, blue and brown students
- Continue to increase the number of community serving projects for our student to get involved and allow them to cultivate the heart of giving and perfect the act of giving back.
- Expand AASuccess Global Impact through DELTA Program teaching English and life skills in selected rural areas in both China and Vietnam

GOAL 2 - JOB INCUBATION

- Increase the number of paid internships by 5 for AASuccess students who have demonstrated outstanding results in applying life skills learning in their individual effort
- Expand job incubation opportunities with AASuccess key partners including BCLC Global Inc. and PSK
- Establish job incubation partners with business partners and sponsors

GOAL 3 - COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

- Expand partnerships
- Develop mentorship training program for new mentors
- Increase student engagement in life skills service learning by 20% for all green and blue students
- Develop the blue print for the Vietnamese Community Center Project
- Expand AASToday Project to accommodate serve1,000 low-income and under-served Vietnamese families from the D.C. Metropolitan area
- Continue to offer YouthCon Scholarship to give high schoolers opportunities to voice their opinions in the betterment of our community.
- Develop scholarship or support to under-served students overseas through DELTA Program.

GOAL 4 - SPONSORSHIP AND VISIBILITY

- Continue to foster the sustaining members program with both existing and new sponsors
- Continue to leverage our senior and brown students for increased community engagement and visibility
- Continue to leverage our life skills service learning via AASToday to generate visibility and funding opportunities
- Raise \$100,000 in 2017
 - 70% of this amount in order to maintain the facility and support the current infrastructure of AASuccess operation
 - 10% Job Incubation opportunities
 - 10% Offering more scholarship programs to under-served students
 - 10% Expand the outreach capacities of AAS Today
