#### **The Period Project**

Menstrual poverty is a secret epidemic that has pervaded the United States, affecting thousands of women who cannot afford or lack access to menstrual hygiene products. The Period Project aims to raise awareness and fundraise to donate feminine hygiene products to local women's shelters and organizations.

**Timeline:** October 2019 - Present **Project Lead:** Ashley Rodriguez, 17, Level 1 Student

**Result:** Successfully fundraised over \$1,300 on Facebook and GoFundMe to offer feminine hygiene products in January 2020 to shelters and organizations in Northern Virginia





#### **10k Runraiser**

# **STUDENT-LED PROJECTS**

#### **PenPal Project**

A modern twist to the traditional penpal arrangement by creating friendships that bridge the gap between the mentees in the U.S. with the mentees in Vietnam via handwriting letters and virtual meetings.

Timeline: November 2019 - Present Project Team Members: Linh Le, 14, Level 1 Student and Jenna Buffenbarger, 14, Level 1 Student Result: Successfully recruited 8 students to participate in the program (three students from the U.S. and five students from Vietnam)

#### Earth Sangha

Nine AASuccess students and mentors volunteered with an organization called Earth Sangha, a local nonprofit with a focus on ecological restoration and environmental conservation. At their plant sale fundraiser, we greeted customers, offered plant lists, directed traffic, and carried their plants to their cars with carts and wheelbarrows.

#### Warm Hearts Winter Drive

### YouthCon Scholarship 2019

This annual scholarship hosted by AASuccess seeks to spark creativity in youth and empower them to give back to their communities. We challenge applicants to express their innovative ideas through an essay submission and an oral presentation. For the first time, this year's first place winner executed their winning project through our on-site summer internship. **Scholarship prompt:** "Giving back is one major component of what makes AASuccess unique. We believe in not only dreaming of change, but also taking action to create that change. Share with us a local or community issue you are passionate about. What program or project would you carry out to work towards a solution with a budget of \$200?"


