Nathan was introduced to AASuccess in 2018 when his sister, Sarah, occasionally brought him to volunteer for events. When he officially joined in the summer, he had no interest in being a member. But to his surprise, his mother had already registered him. This commitment was something he was unaccustomed to since he normally did not actively participate in many activities outside

of school.



Nathan's second year progressed with regular Life Skills sessions. But as Sarah left for college, Nathan was unsure of his continuance at AASuccess. He feared he couldn't communicate with other members. However, he soon realized that AASuccess provided the support to enhance his life skills outside of school. Soon, Nathan began building a foundation for his self-confidence and public speaking skills.



During the COVID-19 pandemic, Nathan's skills blossomed and this year was crucial in developing his passion and work ethic. He felt more comfortable with meeting conversations and took leadership roles in facilitating Life Skills sessions. Witnessing Nathan's increased effort, his mentor encouraged him to work on an animated marketing project for the 2020 AASuccess Youthcon Scholarship.







Beyond Though AASuccess taught Nathan vital skills for his various aspirations, what became most important was the relationship he had with the organization. After countless hours, Nathan assumed his first leadership role in his Afghan Refugee Project. His vision was to provide Afghan families with daily essentials to help them adjust to Northern Virginia. As he successfully executed this project, Nathan found pride within himself and found his confidence. He soon decided to take on one of the largest roles at AASuccess: the main coordinator of the 2022 YouthCon Scholarship.



2021 Life Skills Academy Program

In the seven years I have been with AASuccess, it's astonishing to see how much this organization has changed while still maintaining the true values that we were built on. As my 2021 year drastically changed, I had just found out I would maintain a new role: becoming a mother. From these rushing thoughts, I worried and reflected on the exciting changes in both my own family and my AASuccess family, but these passionate little workers didn't need me to worry.

With the lasting impact of our student alumna Ashley Rodriguez, she enhanced our Core Values Training program that would lead to the constant growth of our students. Concluding our 2021 year, the self-development our students have experienced was facilitated through a strong understanding of our core value sessions. The relevance of this program became ingrained in our students' lives, but we continued to adjust and host the program to assist our students in the application of these skills.

We slowly modified our program to adapt to pertinent topics our students encountered. AASuccess members used core values as a platform to practice abilities they were not familiar with and initiated the confidence they needed to execute community projects. Through this program's goals, the Education, Inspiration, and Motivation Program (EIM) was born (callback intended).

With the introduction of the EIM program, we reinforced the already established Life Skills Academy by integrating relevant, meaningful, and consistent actions into this program. EIM allowed for more of our students to have the chance in developing their public speaking skills and gain the ability to have confidence in expressing their ideas or decision-making. EIM's concepts and lessons brought on a wave of changes to

the students who were eager for more challenges and leadership roles. Many of our students were able to join the Leadership Training Program (LTP) and advanced their proficiency in areas such as project management, conflict resolution, and personal branding. After graduating from LTP, select students were offered internship meetings were found leading positions in AASuccess to truly hone their skills as leaders in a professional setting.

After returning from my hiatus, I noticed the impact that EIM had on our organization and the individual students it had touched. Our students and mentors had become even more rather how deeply we connect

Education, Inspiration, and Motivation, or our EIM program, was created to inspire original civic projects that targets a diverse range of issues. Each factor of EIM feeds into the other, and the combination of these factors work towards the overall objective of the program. As this concept works to address a plethora of our organization's interests, it also builds foundations of leadership, enables future success in our students' professional careers, and instills the philanthropic values of AASuccess in our members.

Our EIM sessions are held every Saturday during AASuccess' office hours in which we focus on each aspect of this model. For the Education factor, we train our students in applying their core values and inform them about vast, relevant world issues and current events. Through Inspiration, we invite guest speakers, conduct roundtable discussions, and

participate in advocacy via community service events related to our focused world issue. Our Motivation aspect includes working on projects with numerous students who promote innovation and synergy.

Our dedication to advocating and allocating resources for mental health is a prime example of how proactive our EIM program is and exemplifies AASuccess' mission. As current factors such as the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, social media toxicity, and competitive schooling worsen peoples' mental health, awareness for these

Core **Value Training**

Our year-round core values training instills the principles needed in our students' professional careers through incorporating active experience and instruction. The core value training acts as a supplement to the Arc360 program as they learn whilst engaging in civic projects with their peers. The curriculum's materials are designed to center around our integrated AASuccess pillars, which ultimately personalizes our students' learning path and nurtures their passion for their aspiring careers. Regardless of the different backgrounds, abilities, and circumstances each student may deal with, each is provided the tools and support they need to excel through this vital program.



Summer Internship



In early 2021, mentors and staff were inspired by the perseverance of its student leaders. Our students overcame vast virtual challenges and continued to find ways to give back to their communities. As they balanced weekly operations at AASuccess and community projects, the difficulties of the distanced collaboration and grit inspired the creation of the Leadership Training Program (LTP).



To support their growth as emerging leaders, we selected seven students to partake in the program. They identified, analyzed, and devised plans that addressed issues in their work, i.e. marketing, operations, etc. To enhance these objectives, our students attended weekly modules hosted by mentors and acquired leadership skills such as crucial conversations, personal branding, and project management.



Students collaborated and actively discussed ways on how to apply these skills in AASuccess, and in their daily lives. With their mentors closely involved, they nurtured their students' end-of-program goals. As LTP concluded, students presented their proposals to a panel of mentors, with an assessment and re-evaluation of their proposals' impact. From there, some students were considered for summer interns. We hope that LTP will become a crucial yearround tool to provide scholarships and prepare students with leadership positions at AASuccess.

Leadership **Training Program**

After LTP's launch, students who excelled in the program were selected to work as paid student interns at AASuccess .As a result, Deanna Morgan, Mckenzie Tran, and Kathleen Pham were selected business skills. Not only has she as the first LTP graduates to form the first round of interns. Their respective skills, strengths, and weaknesses were evaluated as part of LTP which familiarized our her prior knowledge with her staff and mentors on ways we could guide them through our formalized internship program. In the end, these student interns excelled in their designated roles and have demonstrated significant personal and professional growth. They have continued to strengthen the organization's infrastructure by incorporating their voices and other students' voices.

For example, Deanna Morgan has advanced from the beginning refine our internship program, level of our student program to our second level within three months of hard work. This commitment involves a heightened sense of dedication and responsibility to the organization which led her to become the Operations and Program Coordinator Intern. By working on and leading several projects like the 2020 Annual

Report, creating a transition protocol for future interns, and working on AASuccess' communication plan, she vastly enhanced her administrative and been able to improve her own experience at AASuccess, but she has impacted our mentors and students by intertwining newfound skills as an intern.

Through these emerging student leaders and stories, we hope to continue to support and inspire our students while providing them with a safe space to learn from failure. The application and practice of life skills through practical opportunities will continue to cultivate students for this program. From our experiences with our past and present interns, we hope to meet the needs and interests of our students, and leverage their skills for the betterment of the organization. Ultimately, all of our past and current interns have helped pave the way for our future students, and we will continue to inspire our students as we enter a new era of AASuccess.

As we conclude our 2021 year, we have hit our milestone of recruiting 100 students in Vietnam since 2016. With our virtual platforms, our interactive training sessions can provide all participants with experiences of collaboration and networking in America despite the distance and cultural barriers.





Investing in AASuccess' education and apprenticeships nurtures all of our students' professional skills. As AASuccess students are encouraged to serve the community and to support the organization in various capacities, our annual funding goals cannot be reached without the generous help of our partners and volunteers.



Expand our Life Skills Academy

As our flagship program, students are matched with a vetted professional or a program graduate, who serve as a dedicated mentor, guiding students to reach their academic and personal goals. Mentors help our students discover their life values while equipping them with skills and experiences needed to thrive. In 2022, we plan to increase our members by 10%.



Host a Mental Health Conference

Mental health in teens has become frequently discussed in AASuccess due to COVID-19, social media, and school. In 2022, we plan to organize a Mental Health Conference. By sustaining this free event, allowing at least 50 teens in the Washington Metropolitan area to address this issue, AASuccess will ensure that our community's youth is supported in a safe environment.



Energize the AASuccess Internship

Qualified students are trained through a tailored internship to develop their job skills, and the ability to collaborate with others. Through hands-on training, we plan to add at least four positions for (newly graduated) high school students in 2022. The internship will fill the gap in essential job skills outside the academic environment.



Inspire Youth-Led Impact

Our Arc360 Civic Program allows middle and high school students to enact change in their communities. Students plan, lead, and execute projects to support a cause they advocate for with the guidance of mentors and community partners. In 2022, we plan to generate at least 20 student-run projects that produce long-lasting impacts.


Income

Our gross income in 2021 was \$75,219 and our total expense was \$70,762. The net income is \$4,457. The main funding sources of AASuccess were from individual donations, contributions from our board of directors, grants, and donations from members. Most of our funding came from corporate grants and individual donors who support our student-led community projects.

Expense

In 2021, 76% of total expenses went towards student-run community projects, student scholarships and internships, as well as student training programs directed for professional development, mental health, and entrepreneurship.



Due to the ongoing pandemic, AASuccess swapped from our weekly in-person LSA operation to a hybrid work model. More than 50% of funding was allocated to student-run projects that produce impacts on inclusiveness at the community level, e.g. YouthCon scholars who are of diverse racial and social backgrounds, mental health for high school students, and year-round social media campaigns directed towards forming intercultural connections. With the steady support of grants and dedicated members, our students have been able to enjoy their educational journey and the apprenticeships embedded therein that develop the foundation for more deeper efforts in building inclusive and student-centered communities.
