On July 16th, 2024, a Dedication Ceremony celebrated the completion of AAS Huyen's Road Project in Hậu Giang province, Vietnam. This collaborative effort between AASuccess, Prow Charities, and Viet Lotus went far beyond mere infrastructure improvement.



At its heart, this project was about building people as much as it was about building road. Students ranging a from high school to university age, alongside experienced professionals, came together across generational and knowledge gaps. the By project's end, we had not only constructed a road but also forged emotional bonds that transcended cultural and generational boundaries.

This journey reminded us all that learning is a continuous process, one that flourishes when diverse minds come together with a shared purpose. The road we built stands as a testament not just to improved infrastructure, but to the power of collaboration, mentorship, and the enduring impact of bringing together diverse voices for a common cause.









The day after, the 17th, we traveled to Long An to attend Hong Hoa Senior Care Center for a ½ day. That time was all spent conversing with the elderly, around 10 of them, and on matters of their mental health and conditions. Despite just a few interviewees, the care center is a home for about 41 elderly and even 11 orphans.



Traveling to Vietnam was not for just one act of charity but as many for what we can do. For Hong Hoa, we have a mission to provide nutritious meals, ambulances, and an expanse of living space for those living there.

Surely, it's an effort, but it pays off brilliantly because it's worth it, we know that unconditionally, there is no true cost. This, of course, could not be possible without the courtesy of our students, even with adult mentors.
